Tech Talk:

C 4 Frame Rails

Late in the development program, a significant change took place in the C4's frame architecture. Chevrolet Management directed the design group to dump their original T-top design, and replace it with a more fashionable, single piece "Targa" removable top.

Since the T-top's center rail was critical to body rigidity, the transmission tunnel and side frame rails were beefed up to compensate for loss of the center roof rail.

As a result, the side sills are higher and foot well space is smaller, than originally planned.

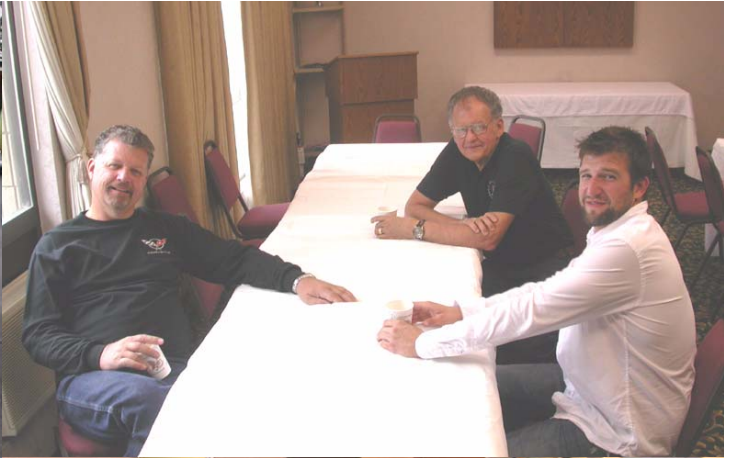

Helpful Hint:

Ran across a slick way of protecting the back end of your C5 and C6 while loading luggage. Buy a towel to match your interior and cut to fit the back end of your car. Your back carpet is held in place by two thumb screws. Punch holes in the towel to fit onto the two threaded screws and attach thumb screws. When not being used, the towel will hang in the back of the trunk area. When loading luggage, pull it out over the highly polished paint on the back of the car. Suitcases will longer put a scratch on the car. It can also be used as an emergency chamois.
