


HAPPY NEW YEAR

This is my Corvette story and I am sticking to it.

I bought my first Corvette, a 1964 convertible in mid-December 1966. I was so proud of it I promptly put the top down, bundled up, turned the heater wide open, and drove it from Lincoln, NE to Abilene, KS area where my parents lived, in 35 degree weather. The car was a 365 hp, 4-speed car with the only other option being the AM-FM radio. It was originally black with black top and black interior. The paint already had a few crow's feet in it and I was not particularly fond of the color. I had previously worked in a body shop prepping cars for a complete repaint so I prepped the Vette. Paint was cheap back then so I purchased a Cadillac cinnamon brown and the owner of the shop shot it for \$30. I had people stop me on the street and ask what the color was and where I had gotten it



painted. They loved the color although I was still a nerd in the eyes of the girls. Just a nerd with a Corvette.

In the fall of '68, I changed colleges and went to a school in the Chattanooga, TN area. That is where I met Cindy. Car theft was very bad in the area so I installed a hidden dead switch which grounded the distributor. The



top was cut in a mall parking lot and the ignition switch was knocked out but the thieves were not able to start the car so they abandoned the theft. The new top was white. By now, I was tiring of the car. Two amp meters had burned out and the car leaked water terribly. I drilled holes in the floor boards so at least I didn't have standing water in the car. On one trip to Atlanta, Cindy curled up on the seat in order to avoid the water pouring over the windshield under the top seal.

Summer of '69 I was home in Kansas, my father was driving the car and it quit on him about a block from the house. We pushed it home and put the car in a basement garage. Ten minutes later the house was on fire. A fuel line had broken and the car was sitting right around a corner from a gas water heater that came on.

The volunteer fire department showed up and was able to save the house although everything was black from the tire burning. In the course of putting out the fire, they tried to pull the car out of the garage by hooking a

chain on the bottom of the fiberglass and yelling go. Then after the car was outside one fireman decided the fire was in the engine itself so he pried off the air cleaner and turned a hose down the carburetor.

Five year old Corvettes were not worth much at the time so the insurance company totaled it which was fine with me. I was done with Corvettes for a while. We think Kent Michael purchased the salvage but then sold it without restoring it. In 1971, we purchased a '69 coupe for my younger brother to drive. He drove it for a year or two and then sold it to purchase a Datsun 240Z which were the hot item then.

In 1985 I purchased an '81 beige over bronze and have continuously owned a Vette since.
