## Minutes from the July 24, 2013 ACCC E-Board Meeting

The Air Capital Corvette Club eboard had a meeting on 7-24-13, Present were Glen Bailey, Mike McKee, Ron Boswell, Kent Michael and Gary Jones. Travis Pearson was gone because he had to work and Daryl Burbach was in New Mexico. Monte Rans also came to the meeting. Since Daryl was out of town, Gary wrote these minutes.

The main topic of the meeting was the Blacktop Nationals autocross. Gary has been checking to make sure BTN is providing insurance for ACCC for the autocross. Gary has talked to Cindi at BTN and to Todd Miller with M & M Insurance that provides insurance for BTN. Gary says the bottom line is that BTN is not providing any insurance that names ACCC on the policy or provides coverage for ACCC. BTN says it provides insurance for "volunteers," but Gary does not believe that provides any coverage for ACCC. (Prior to this eboard meeting there have been numerous emails and several discussions about the insurance issue among the eboard members and Monte.)

Monte was asked at the eboard meeting if BTN is willing to name ACCC and its members on its insurance policy. Monte said BTN is not willing to do that. Monte had just come from a BTN meeting where this was discussed. Monte said he needed to know if ACCC was going to do the autocross so he could make other arrangements if ACCC wasn't going to do it.

More discussion was had among the eboard members. The members felt like the autocross was a fun event and wanted ACCC to do it, but they felt they had to have insurance and BTN was not providing the insurance. They didn't want to expose the club and its members to liability for an accident with no insurance coverage.

A formal vote was taken on whether ACCC should be involved with the autocross. Travis had previously voted in an email. Daryl was called on the phone to get this vote. The final vote was six to one that ACCC not participate in the autocross due to the lack of insurance.

After that a general discussion was held of miscellaneous topics. Louise Michael made some great cobbler, and we ate that with ice cream.
